WITH ASIAN TOUR



Habitat for Humanity teamed up with the Asian Tour as the golf tour's 2018 Sustainable Development Partner, to bring the need for decent housing closer to the hearts of the golfing community in the region, and the rest of the world.

In line with the partnership, the Asian Tour's season-long "Order of Merit" rankings was renamed the "Habitat for Humanity Standings." This branded leaderboard led to massive visibility for Habitat across multiple broadcast channels in over 14 countries in Asia, the Pacific and beyond.

The one-year partnership opened many doors. Several professional golfers became Habitat ambassadors and wore our logo on their golf apparel or bag when they played in Asian Tour golf tournaments. There were many activation events organized on the golf course and off the course in India, Indonesia, Malaysia, New Zealand, South Korea and Thailand. Together, Habitat and Asian Tour collaborated to create avenues for the golfing community to support meaningful housing and shelter projects across Asia through the raising of resources, awareness and volunteers.

Since 2004, the Asian Tour has developed the sport of golf by providing a path to success and is now the third largest tour in the world. It has a diverse and committed membership rooted in Asia, and a global voice with an estimated reach of more than 466 million households because of its worldwide television reach, digital media platforms and traditional press coverage.

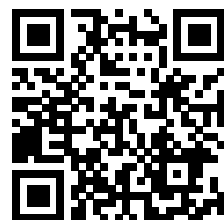
**Buy a Mulligan:** The golf players bought mulligan shots, the proceeds of which were donated to Habitat India.

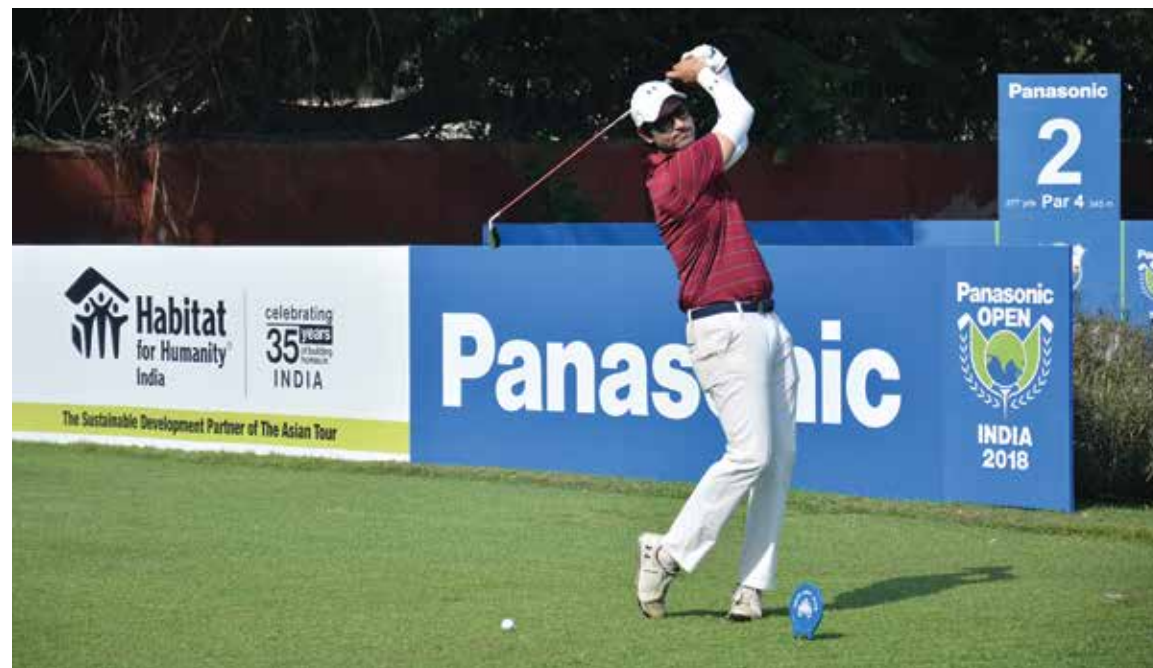




# HABITAT FOR HUMANITY INDIA PRO-AM AT THE PANASONIC OPEN 2018

The Pro-Am was held in support of families in need of decent shelter and sanitation, people affected by the floods in Kerala and vulnerable communities such as farmers' widows. The event witnessed a cross-section of professional and amateur golfers such as Miguel Carballo (Argentina), Lionel Weber (France), former Indian cricketers Murali Kartik and S. Badrinath, and business leaders like R. Gopal (Managing Director - Goodrich Maritime), Arjun Nohwar (Head - Asia Pacific - Uber for Business, Uber) and Yvo Metzelaar (Managing Director - Pressto India) who came together to support Habitat for Humanity India.

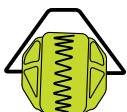

**C.V. Unni** is unable to work for long hours as he has a neurological disorder and cerebral thrombosis which affects his movement and coordination. So, he left his carpentry work and switched to selling lottery tickets. Unni and his wife Sathi find it difficult to make both ends meet through this meagre income. Their only daughter Unnimaya is studying for a Masters in Chemistry through financial support from well wishers.

The Kerala floods of August 2018 washed away everything they had. They were evacuated to shelter camps and when they returned, the house was in ruins and had completely caved in from one side.

"We were in a very desperate situation, unable to continue living in our own house after returning from the relief camp. I have a medical problem and we're barely making ends meet. The absence of a proper house

bothered us. We approached many local representatives for help, but finally it was Habitat for Humanity India who helped us.

West Indies batting legend Brian Lara gave a fillip to the Habitat for Humanity India movement by supporting its Charity Golf Tournament.

Lara, who thrilled the cricketing world with his exquisite brand of batting, had arrived in the city from Australia on Thursday for the India-West Indies Twenty20 and ODI series' expert comments assignment for Star Sports. He took time off to inaugurate the charity event at Willington Sports Club at Mahakaxmi on Friday.

Former India cricketers Ajit Agarkar and S. Badrinath, and former Olympian Rehan Poncha, a six-time national champion in the 100 m and 200 m butterfly event, also took part in the event. The winner of the tournament will get a chance to play a round of

Lara expressed his love for India and endorsed former England captain Michael Atherton's view that the game played in the Mumbai maidans represents the soul of cricket.

damental for families. The movement goes across 70 countries in the world. My first experience was actually in Trinidad and Tobago where they build and repair houses for the less fortunate. It's a big thing, and hopefully one day I would like to put on the clothes and head out to the fields where they do the building. I would love to do that one day. I hope all of you bring this needy cause to everybody's attention," said Lara.

**'Pure destiny'**  
Lara recalled his first connection with Habitat for Humanity in India at a function in England in 2011. He said, "M.S. Dhoni was there. Everybody concerned paid attention at that point of time. Eight years later this relationship is pure destiny. This is the second edition of the Charity Golf Tournament."

reactive against and on from his father, legendary sprinter Mike Stoltz. "Dad obviously was from the army and he would tell me to work hard. He still does. He is disciplined and you have to be honest and sincere in your practice. He still says the same thing. I tell him, 'Dad, I am nearly 60.' He says, 'But you are still my son,'" recalls the officer.

Jock is obviously excited that his son Harjal has already picked up golf, but he is careful not to pass on any burden of expectations. "As a parent, I don't put any pressure on him. I don't even coach him. I was coaching for him because he wanted me to be there. He plays back ball, cricket, golf. When he gets to the age of 12, if he is interested

It's great to see these young kids coming up; they are strong enough material to rule on the world. I have seen a lot of good Indian films. Shashidhar is playing really well. Then there is Ashmit, Shiv Gargur, Ganeshwar Ghoshkar, Sibi Chakravarti, Kishore Kumar, Chinmay Chanda, many good players. One who, when things click, they can win a major championship. It could happen this year. Every Indian actor has it in him," he says.

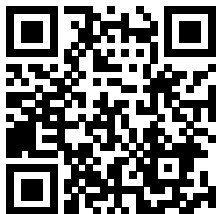

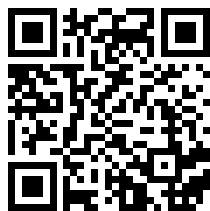

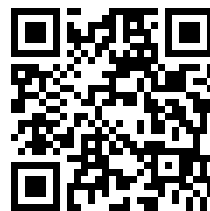
