As we endeavor towards creating a safer and healthier environment, it is vital to put into perspective that the small steps we take now will create a lasting impact for the future generations. Going forward we encourage the Coalition to join

# SENSITISE TO SANITISE COALITION

The Sensitise to Sanitise Coalition (S2S) Coalition is a network of organizations working in various aspects of the sanitation ecosystem including household sanitation, school sanitation, community sanitation, access to water, waste management, etc. The S2S Coalition currently comprises of 19 partners who have come together with a focus to converge skills, knowledge and experience to work towards improving access to sanitation for marginalized communities. It encompasses practitioners, technology providers, research agencies, donors and funding agencies, micro finance companies and international

NGOs, seeking to systematically implement projects towards achieving ODF districts in India.

The Coalition was initiated by Habitat for Humanity in July 2015 and its partners work across 25 states in India. The Coalition has reached out to 16 million individuals through various sanitation interventions from July 2015 to Dec 2016. Habitat for Humanity India is currently the Secretariat of the S2S Coalition and the Managing Director of HHF India Chairs the Working Committee of the Coalition.

We aim to partner with more organizations sharing the

mission of the Coalition which is to improve the sanitation scenario in India and align objectives and interventions in achieving an ODF India and ODF plus India!

Pinky Kuswaha, hailing from the tiny village of Chhote baba Ki Pahadiya, in Morar block Gwalior, Madhya Pradesh, did not have a toilet at home. *“After constructing the toilet, my children are safe and free from contracting diseases. They go to school regularly and lead a life with dignity,”* says Pinky Kuswaha.

Engage in joint fundraising initiatives from multiple stakeholders like corporates, High Net worth Individuals, foundations etc.

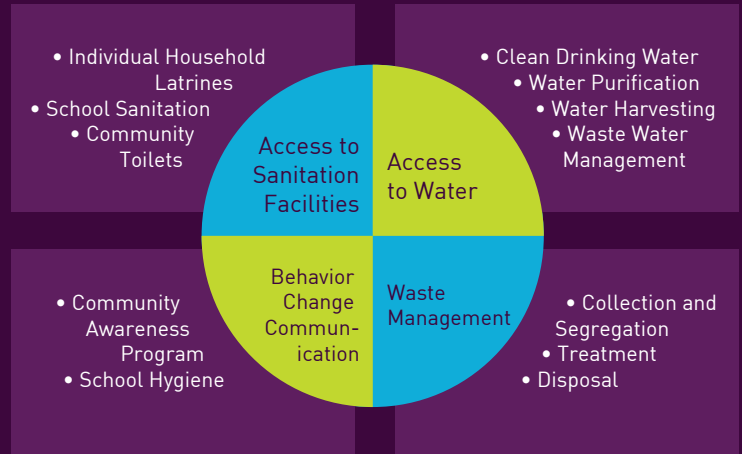


## OBJECTIVES OF THE COALITION

- To increase the membership base of the Sensitise to Sanitise Coalition from 13 to 50 partners by December 2016.

# THE S2S COALITION UPDATE



The S2S Coalition as a collaborative endeavor has developed a technical handbook on sanitation construction do's and don'ts. The manual has been written by Habitat for Humanity India on behalf the S2S Coalition. The manual is focused on knowledge sharing of best practices, technical aspects and views on the future of sanitation construction demand.

The technical handbook has welcomed and included insights from members who are pioneers in the realm of engineering innovative designs from among the Coalition.

The S2S Coalition 'Working-Committee' comprising of World Vision India, WASH Institute, Gramalaya, Consortium for DEWATS Dissemination Society and Habitat for Humanity India are working together with the aim to eliminate sanitation challenges through a district approach in Padukottai, Tamil Nadu. A joint proposal is being developed.

ASHA has helped families in Odisha get direct access to sanitation units. In the last 6 months, 241 families living in rural and urban sectors have been impacted.



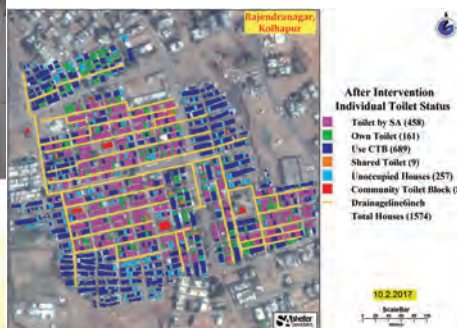

## CASE STORY - FINISH Society

Mamta Devi is an inspiration for her community. FINISH Society embarked upon the journey to make the Manjhwa Block consisting of 44 Gram Panchayats with a highly sensitive and politicized environment ODF. In Mirzapur in October 2016, the community came forward and showed their enthusiasm to make their region Open Defecation Free. One such force was Mamta Devi, a physically challenged woman headed the Nigrani Samiti and would walk the length and breadth of the village with the

community to dissuade people from defecating in the open and

making their village hygienic and clean.

# STORIES FROM THE FIELD - School Sanitation

## School Sanitation

In response to the Tamil Nadu flood of 2015, LEAF Society extended support in rebuilding a school sanitation complex for a school affected by the flood in Cuddalore. Today, young girls and boys are able to attend school with safe sanitation facilities giving rise to a brighter future. The school which is in the rural outskirts of Cuddalore brings education to the children.

In 2016 Banka BioLoo began operations in Uttarakhand and Bihar, initiating their involvement through school sanitation programs.



## CASE STORY - GRAMALAYA

*"I remember the days when I would have to stagger my toilet timings because I could only go out after 6 pm. And at school, since we never had toilets we would have to wait for school to get over. I think this is the reason my sister and mother took ill as they suffered infection every day.*

*I must take care of my mother and elder sister along with my education.*

*I am so happy that I am safer and have a toilet with an incinerator.*

*Even if my education cannot be completed my prime concern is to set a healthy way of living for my family."*

# STORIES FROM THE FIELD

## Community Toilets: Innovative Sanitation Infrastructure

Habitat for Humanity India entered into a partnership with Thane Municipal Corporation (TMC) to build 10 community sanitation complexes in the district of Thane. Our first community Sanitation Complex in Sathewadi, Thane intends to impact 500 individuals - men, women, children and differently abled individuals. With support from TMC this is a step towards making Thane an open defecation free district.

The Community Sanitation

Complex advocates for collective behavior change through mobilization of communities to end the practice of open defecation. Due to space constraints faced in the urban slum clusters, the CSC is an efficient preference over Individual Households Latrines (IHHLs). In the urban setting, it is an effective solution to reduce open defecation and maintain safety and dignity of women and young girls, offering them access to better sanitation facilities.

# STORIES FROM THE FIELD - Access to Water

## Access to water for Sanitation

FINISH Society - through their efforts was successful in providing 23,065 individual household toilets across the country. These units were supplied with attached water tanks easing access of water for marginalized communities.

# CASE STORY- WORLD VISION

“My name is Pushpita Pradhan and I’m 25 years old. I live in Petumaha village in Daringbadi with my husband, Nalit, and two children Sushmita and Milita. I’m pregnant and access to water has been a big issue here, especially clean drinking water. The closest water source is across the fields, and during the monsoon, the rain and mud make it very challenging to get there.”

I’m the only one who collects water for our family and I constantly worry for my unborn child as I make my way to the water source and back. It’s hard enough navigating the slippery path but I also carry 30 liters of water on my

head. My legs hurt and my chest aches with fatigue.

The water pipeline provided by World Vision India will reach the doorstep of every household in the village. That means no more long walks through muddy paths. Once the pipeline is functional it can help with access to clean drinking water, safer environments and even helping to sustain my kitchen garden. The entire community has also agreed to help cover the costs for the water filter system and its maintenance. In total we have to pay Rs.1500 each for the construction and an additional Rs.10 every month for its maintenance.

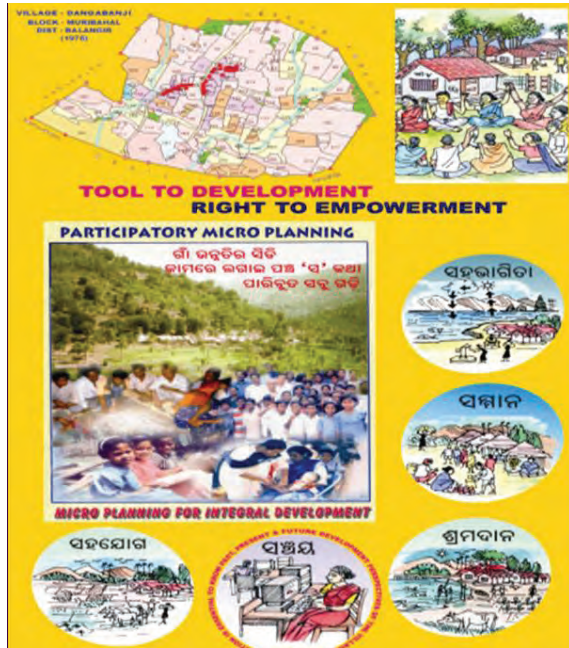


# COMMUNITY AWARENESS PROGRAMS

Udyama through its advocacy initiatives has helped sensitise women in Odisha. Their efforts have helped eradicate poverty

by providing women hygiene awareness and empowering them through skill building programs. Udyama has lent a

voice to women-centric movements to not only improve access to water for sanitation but also to end water poverty across the state.

# WASTE MANAGEMENT

*“Solid waste management (SLWM) is one of the seven components of sanitation. Although Total Sanitation Campaign (TSC) guidelines initially focused on human excreta management and eliminating the practice of open defecation in rural India.*

*The department of Drinking Water Supply in the Ministry of Rural Development, Government of India has modified the TSC guidelines and included a component of solid and liquid waste management to address the larger needs of the community.”*

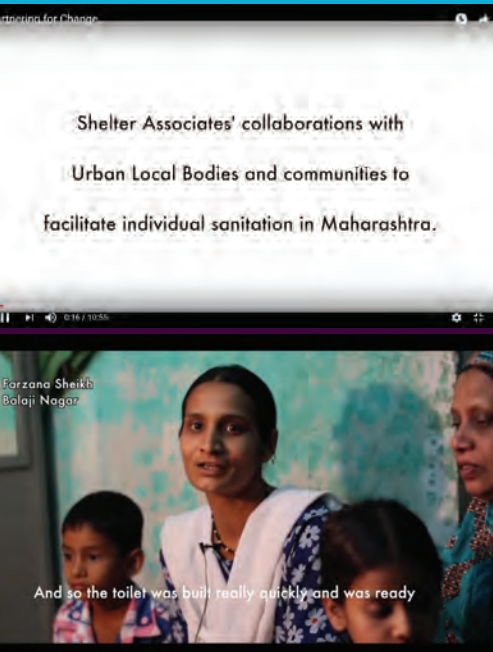

## A short film: Partnering for Change

The 'One home One Toilet' project initiated by Shelter Associates in 2013 aimed at providing sanitation units to families across cities in Maharashtra. This led to Shelter Associates partnering with various stakeholders who contributed to the effective delivery of individual household sanitation units.

Through these partnerships the organization has impacted families in 5 cities of Maharashtra. The short film: Partnering for Change Captures their work narrating stories from the field on the direct and

indirect impact on families living in urban slum.

## Partnering with the Government

Promoting the essence of partnership, in Dec 2016, Gramalaya and Habitat for Humanity India entered into a partnership with the Government of Puducherry with the objective of making the union territory open defecation free by October 2017. Through the adoption of the community led total sanitation approach the organizations shall provide 46,000 families with improved sanitation facilities in the districts for Karaikal and Puducherry.

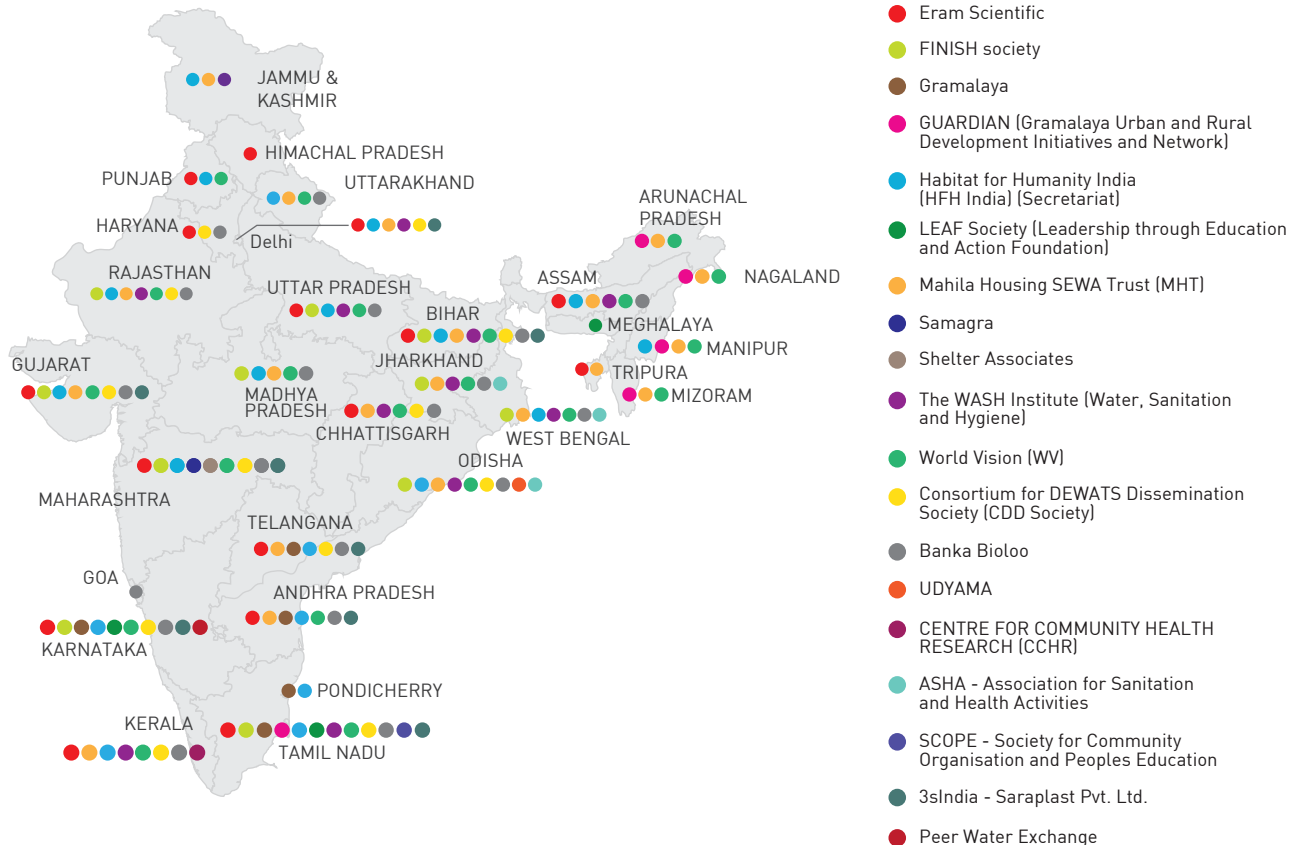
