FROM THE MANAGING DIRECTOR'S DESK



Dear Friends,

The Universal Declaration of Human Rights adopted by the United Nations General Assembly in 1948, clearly states that everyone "... has the right to a standard of living adequate for the health and wellbeing of himself/herself and his/her family, including food, clothing, housing, and medical care and necessary social services..."

At Habitat for Humanity for India, we believe that sustainable and inclusive housing strategies can lay the foundation for achieving long-term economic and social development, especially among women. Project Nirmanshree, funded by the European Union, is one such initiative that has become a foundation upon which thousands of women are building their lives and livelihoods. Despite several setbacks caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, the project has been able to proactively engage with the participants and stakeholders to achieve the primary target of training 3000 women in the Recognition of Prior Learning and Entrepreneurship Development Program from Beed and Osmanabad in Maharashtra, Dhenkanal, and Jajpur in Odisha. 50 social enterprises have been established as standalone businesses or as a collective. In addition, 10 women have received subsidized loan from the Prime Minister's **Employment Generation** Programme to start their husinesses

This is possible because of the tireless efforts of our staff in Maharashtra and Odisha, who operating under several restrictions exhibited exemplary perseverance and adopted innovative tools to ensure that the project makes a significant impact on the lives of women. We are immensely grateful to the European Union for making this project a reality and for their continued support.

Through this initiative, we are hopeful that women at the grassroots will achieve the strength, stability, and selfreliance they need to build a better future for themselves, their families, and their communities.

PROJECT IN BRIEF

Habitat for Humanity India in partnership with the European Union is implementing Project Nirmanshree in Beed and Osmanabad districts of Maharashtra and Dhenkanal and Jajpur districts of Odisha.

'Nirman', translated from Hindi means 'construction'. 'Shree', adapted from the ancient Sanskrit language represents the 'female gender'. In combining the two words, Nirmanshree means 'Building Women'.

Project Nirmanshree facilitates the entry of welltrained women workforce into the male-dominated construction sector, offering them opportunities for better livelihood and making the housing eco-system conducive for women. Habitat India is bringing women together by collaborating with women federations and self-help groups.

Project Nirmanshree aims to provide technical and entrepreneurial skills to 3000 women and establish 50 social enterprises.

Despite the setbacks posed by COVID-19, Project Nirmanshree has seen steady progress at the end of year 2. Project participants received training and support in the following focused areas:

Construction Skill Building:

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) Certificate issued to 3000 women participants through the Construction Skill Development Council (CSDC). The certificate is recognized by the National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC), Government of India.


Entrepreneurship Development Program:

Through a partnership with an entrepreneurship development agency, Habitat India trained 3000 women to develop their technical and entrepreneurial skills.

Backward and Forward Linkages through Government Schemes:

To explore the linkages of financial support, Government subsidies and schemes are introduced to the women. They are provided with handholding support to apply and access schemes such as the Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP).


NIRMAN APP

Nirman App is a mobile application built specifically for project participants to easily access information on running an enterprise, banking, marketing and employment opportunities in the housing ecosystem. The app is available in English, Marathi, and Odiya. Resources available in the Nirman App can be downloaded easily. The resources can also be shared with women from the neighborhood communities or villages who are outside the direct purview of the project. This will enable the effective facilitation of financial inclusion in hard-to-reach areas. The app

is helping reduce the need for travel, and face-to-face interactions and increasing accessibility.

AWARENESS AND LINKAGES WORKSHOPS

4 district-level awareness and linkages workshops were conducted in Maharashtra (Beed and Osmanabad) and Odisha (Dhenkanal and Jajpur) to spread awareness and advocate for greater participation of women in the housing sector and the housing ecosystem. These workshops, conducted in April 2022, saw the participation of 231 women.

Beed: 73 women participants Osmanabad: 60 women participants Dhenkanal: 53 women participants Jajpur: 45 women participants

Maharashtra

5th-7th April 2022: 133 women participated in two gender advocacy workshops (60 in Osmanabad and 73 in Beed). Under the theme, 'Gender Equality and Enabling Women's Access to the Housing Ecosystem', participants were briefed on skill-based work and prospects of the housing ecosystem. Mr. Nitin Chavan, District Labour Officer; Mr. R. K. Bagde, District Rural Development Agency Official; Mr. Bandu Khade, Mahatma Phule Economic Development Corporation; Mr. D. A. Patil, District Industries Centre Office – Beed; Ms. Reshma Shaikh, Member – Project Advisory Committee attended the workshop along with the members of the Women Federations and Self-Help Groups.



Odisha

27th April 2022: Two district-level workshops were conducted on 'Issues and Gaps in Executing Different Government Schemes for Advocacy Strategy' at Jajpur and Dhenkanal, Odisha. Ms. Jayanti Dalai, Block Chairman, Korei; Mr. Prashant Padhi, Deputy Program Manager - Odisha Livelihood Program; and Mr. Chinmay Singh, Coordinator - Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MNREGA) guided the women entrepreneurs at this workshop. 98 women participated in these workshops.

In line with this position, Nirmanshree entrepreneurs are trained in producing lowcarbon emissions recycled products such as fly ash bricks, cement bricks, coir rope, pavement blocks, and products made from bamboo. Featured below are some women entrepreneurs who have leveraged their training to start their businesses producing low-carbon emission products.

Chaya Shinde Osmanabad, Maharashtra

Chaya Shinde (32), lives with her husband Pandurang and their three children – Tanushka (11), Aryan (10), and Aditi (8) – in Mandava, Osamanabad district, Maharashtra. She was employed as a construction worker along with Pandurang, who is a mason.

Chaya attended the training offered by Project Nirmanshree in construction-related skills and learned that she was quite good at making cleaning products. She attended the Social Enterprises Training and Entrepreneurship Training Program held in September 2021. In the training program, Chaya learned how to build a business and sustain it.

"The toilet cleaning products are household items with a good demand in the village and nearby communities," says Chaya who identified the need for her product and established her enterprise in June 2022.

What is unique about her enterprise is the network built for marketing and sale of this product. Chaya has assigned two women from Mandava village who are in turn linked with shops in 5 other villages. In total, she has 10 women supporting the sale and earning a commission from it.

"Thanks to the training and handholding support offered by the team of Project Nirmanshree, I have been able to build this business from the ground up and sell products that are important for running the households of many families." - Chaya.



Reshma Gunthal Beed, Maharashtra

Reshma is a woman entrepreneur from Malegaon village in Beed district, Maharashtra. Along with her husband, Vilas Gunthal, Reshma started an enterprise to provide clean drinking water in her locality. Called New Renuka Cool Aqua, Reshma's enterprise provides water purified through Reverse Osmosis to the villagers since 2019. The capital to start the business was pooled together by her family.

She learned about Project Nirmanshree through the self-help group she was a part of. She attended the Recognition of Prior Learning and Entrepreneurship Training Program which helped her to grow as an entrepreneur and tackle business-related issues. She learned bookkeeping, financial management, and marketing which enabled her to tackle the challenges she faced in the day-to-day running and expansion of the enterprise.

"I learned and gained a lot from the project. It has given me a new perspective to grow my business and sustain my family," says Reshma.

With handholding support from Nirmanshree team, she applied for the PMEGP loan (Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme) to augment her business. Reshma also received financial support of INR 30,000 from Habitat under Project Nirmanshree to purchase a cooling machine for the RO plant, to expand the business further.





Sabita Moharana Jajpur, Odisha

Sabita Moharana from Amrutia village located in Jajpur district, Odisha is a first-generation entrepreneur who is running a carpentry unit, along with her carpenter husband Rajendra Moharana. They are supporting their household of five with income from this small enterprise.

Sabita attended the Recognition of Prior Learning training for assistant masons followed by the Entrepreneurship Development Program and Government Schemes where she learned how to successfully run and market her business and received an orientation on Government entitlements and schemes available for entrepreneurs.

Shortly after, she registered the carpentry unit receiving the UDHYAM registration number issued for Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises by the Government of India. Further, she received handholding support to apply for a loan under Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme



(PMEGP). She was successfully granted a loan of INR 3,35,000 (US\$ 4213). She also received financial support of INR 25,000 (US\$ 314) as seed money from Habitat for Humanity. In addition to this, she received comprehensive Entrepreneurship Skill Development training from the Regional Industries Centre, Jajpur, Government of India.

"I am grateful for the opportunity Project Nirmanshree has afforded a woman like me. Because of the training and support I was given through this project, I feel empowered to run and sustain this business," says Sabita.

Sabita and Rajendra employ 5 people in their unit, hiring and training skilled carpenters in the locality. Their enterprise brings in an average profit of INR 15,000 per month.

On 6th October 2022, Sabita completed her first order of home furniture for a local buyer. The total value of the furniture sold amounted to INR 80,000 (USD 967.98).

Namita Rani Das Dhenkanal, Odisha

Namita Rani Das and her husband Dipta Rajan live in Ward No.9, Dhenkanal, Odisha with their daughters Laxmipriya (23), and Subhashree (18). They run a construction material business supplying shuttering and centring tools essential for building a concrete structure.

Namita has been working on the shuttering and centring business along with her husband since 2020, employing 4 people from her locality. She attended the Recognition of Prior Learning training for assistant masons followed by the Entrepreneurship Development Program and Government Schemes where she learned how to successfully run and market her business and received an orientation on Government entitlements and schemes available for entrepreneurs.

"I signed up for project Nirmanshree because there was a need to expand the business to support our growing family. Participating in RPL (Recognition of Prior Learning) training on Assistant Mason and EDP (Entrepreneurship Development Program and Government Schemes) opened my eyes to more possibilities such as government schemes and product marketing. It helped me expand the business," says Namita.

After completing her training, Namita worked to scale up the business, receiving seed money support of INR 25,000 from Habitat. Through this funding and their savings, she invested in increasing the carpet area of the shuttering and centring tools. This drastically increased their capacity to respond to multiple orders in the locality.


